<u>COLUMBIAN CHARITIES</u> (From the January Golden State Knightletter)

2018 was a very active year for Columbian Charities especially in the last few months. As you know, 69 Brothers of Council #7773 in Paradise lost their homes due to the Paradise Camp fire. Completely burned out! California Columbian Charites was there to help within a few days. Each burned out Brother received a grant of \$3,000 to accommodate their immediate "necessity of life" needs. The Charity President expedited these grants. Accumulated, the Charity granted \$207,000 in aid to these Brothers. The Charity had to withdraw from the contingency fund to accommodate the checks written. Supreme helped out with a donation of \$120,000 to the Charity. Also, generous checks in the amount of over \$25,000 from individual Knights, Councils and Businesses from our State and other States helped. The Charity is very appreciative of these generous donors. Now is the time to replenish our funds to be able to continue to support other Brothers that are in need throughout the State.


